

North American Mobility Program Student Exchange Application Form

The North American Mobility Program (NAMP) is a five year program awarded to Dr. Christine Jamieson, Associate Professor of the Department of Theological Studies, by Human Resources and Social Development Canada (HRSDC). The program involves a consortium of three universities from Canada (Concordia University, Université de Montréal, and Saint Paul University), three from the United States (Howard University, University of Texas El Paso, and Hope College), and three from Mexico (Universidad de Queretaro, Universidad Autonoma Popular des Estado Puebla, Universidad Anahuac). It is part of the International Academic Mobility, National Office of Literacy and Learning that seeks to encourage co-operation in higher education and training among the three countries with a focus on student mobility.

Over the span of four years, approximately nine *graduate or upper level undergraduate* students from Saint Paul University will study for one semester in one of the universities in Mexico or the United States. In addition, approximately nine students from either Mexico or the United States will study at Saint Paul University for one semester. The program provides these students with an opportunity to take courses related to the theme of Ethical and Policy Issues in the Sciences. It also will support some shorter-term mobility among professors.

Selection criteria for applicants:

- ❖ Graduate or upper-level undergraduate student at Saint Paul University; GPA of 3.00 or higher;
- ❖ Canadian citizen, a landed immigrant or have been granted refugee status in Canada;
- ❖ some proficiency in Spanish if you are choosing a university in Mexico (some language training will be provided);
- ❖ a valid social insurance number is required and student should not be in receipt of Employment Insurance (EI) benefits;
- ❖ pay tuition and general fees to Saint Paul University before leaving for host institution.

The program provides you with an opportunity to take courses related to the theme of Ethical and Policy Issues in the Sciences. A stipend will be provided before your departure for travel and additional living costs at the host institution. Academic credits earned from courses taken at the host institution will be received at your home institution (Saint Paul University).
