

# McEuen Scholarship (Scotland)

The McEuen Scholarship was established in 1974 by Mrs. Stuart "Dolly" McEuen and her niece, Mhairi Angela McLeod. It encourages Canadian students to pursue their studies at The University of St. Andrews in Fife, Scotland. It is awarded to qualified Canadian students age 21 and younger for a full three-year undergraduate or a four-year honours degree at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. Awarded annually to a resident Canadian citizen, this renewable entrance scholarship is awarded on the basis of academic and extra-curricular achievement.

**Award Name:** McEuen Scholarship

**Eligible Fields of Study:** any

**Type(s) of Program:** high school entering B.A.; B.A.

**Further Criteria:**

- Applicants must reside in Canada and be Canadian citizens.
- Applicants must not be more than 21 years of age on December 31st of the year preceding the award of the Scholarship.
- An Applicant, if not already attending a university, must be qualified for admission into a university in Canada.
- An Applicant should have a strong academic record. In addition, applicants will need to demonstrate that they possess the initiative and independence to profit from the experience of studying in another country.
- An Applicant must not hold a university degree at the date of his or her admission to the University of St. Andrews.

**Value:** variable (tuition and residence fees; £200 book allowance)

**Application Deadline:** January 31<sup>st</sup> 2018
