

## MLA STYLE, 8<sup>TH</sup> EDITION

General format of in-text citations is as follows: (last name of author page number); note the absence of punctuation between the two elements. You can also use the author's name in your sentence, immediately followed by the page number in parentheses. Examples of both types of in-text citations are provided throughout this handout.

Example: (Lowery and Burrow 341) *or* Lowery and Burrow (341)

### Important notes

- Each in-text citation must have a corresponding entry in the Works Cited section.
- Place the heading Works Cited centered at the top of a new page.
- Arrange the works cited in alphabetical order by author (or any other word placed at the beginning of an entry).
- Reference list entries have a hanging indent of 0.5 in.
- Double-space the works-cited list (within and between entries).
- The date of access of an online source is optional, except when the source's publication date is unavailable or unclear. In that case, include it at the end of the entry. Ex.: Accessed 23 July 2019.
- When providing a URL, make sure you omit the *https://* or *http://*.
- Use standard capitalization for all titles, regardless of source type and even when formatted otherwise at the source.
- If a source has more than one author, use the examples provided under "Book" and then combine with the appropriate document type format.

### Book

*For e-books: include the database or platform name after the publication date, followed by the DOI or URL (see example below).*

#### One author

#### Three or more authors

### Chapter of an edited book

In-text citation	(Katz 38-39) or Katz (38-39)

### Translated book

*Reference list entries for translated (and otherwise republished) books contain two dates: the date of original publication (placed after the title) and the date of the translated version's publication (placed at the end).*

### Journal article

*If a DOI is not provided, include the URL after the database name instead.*

### Newspaper or news website article

*Use this format for articles from newspapers, news websites, and online magazines (Ottawa Citizen, New York Times, CNN, HuffPost, BBC News, CBC News, Radio-Canada, The Atlantic, Macleans, etc.).*

*If a source has no page numbers but provides paragraph numbers, use those with the abbreviation "par." in the in-text citation. If a source has no explicit page or paragraph numbers, omit this element (do not count them).*

### Thesis or dissertation

### Government publication or report

When a document is published by an agency or organization that is also its author, begin the entry with the title of the document followed by the name of the agency or organization (see first example below).

### Webpage (general, institutional, or organizational)

When a webpage is published by an organization or institution that is also its author, begin the entry with the title of the webpage followed by the name of the organization or institution (see first two examples below).

### Course lecture or PowerPoint slides

*Describe the type of source (lecture, handout, PowerPoint presentation, etc.) at the end of the entry.*

### Email

*The author is the person who sent the email in question. The title is the entirety of the subject line in quotation marks. The recipient's name follows "Received by."*

Reference	Day, Jessica. "Re: Ongoing Negotiations." Received by Winston Bishop, 15 May 2020.
In-text citation	(Day) <i>or</i> In an email to the author, Day indicated that...

### Tweet

*Begin the entry with the username followed by the text of the publication in its entirety in quotation marks. If you know the user's real name, include it in parentheses after their username, as in the example below; if you don't, omit it.*

*In your works-cited list, alphabetize using the first letter of the username.*

### Facebook post

*Facebook posts can be lengthy, so include the first few words or the first sentence of the post in quotation marks in lieu of a title.*

### Instagram post

*Instagram posts can be lengthy, so include the first few words or the first sentence of the post in quotation marks in lieu of a title.*

### YouTube, Vimeo, or other online video

*Begin the entry with the name of the creator of the video if it is different from the name of the account (username) that uploaded the video. If the creator of the video is the same person (or account) that uploaded the video, include it only once, after “uploaded by,” and begin the entry with the title of the video in quotation marks (see example below).*
