Saint-Paul University invites media to the public conference Where Have All The (Good) Leaders Gone? presented by Bishop Dennis Drainville.

Ottawa, December 6, 2011 – "The most serious deficit that Canada faces as a nation is its leadership deficit. This national challenge goes far beyond the fact the three main opposition parties in the House of Commons are virtually leaderless", says Canadian Anglican Bishop and former member of the provincial parliament, Dennis Drainville. Mgr. Drainville, who's part of the Anglican Diocese of Quebec, will present the conference Where Have All The (Good) Leaders Gone? that will be held in English, Wednesday, December 7th at 7 p.m. at the University's Auditorium (223 Main Street). This event is hosted by the Anglican Studies Program of the Faculty of Theology.

This lecture will address the reasons for the present deficit in leadership and suggest some strategies on how we can engage in solving this crisis. Bishop Drainville will also comment on the lamentable prospects of finding leaders for the present main-line parties in the House of Commons.

Bishop Dennis Drainville speaks from his experience as a leader in the Church, as well as from his background as a lifelong social activist and former NDP member of Ontario's Legislative Assembly.
