- Reporting to the President and CEO, provide executive leadership for clinical and organizational ethics, mission integration, diversity and inclusion, spiritual care, interpretive and translation services, and the critical incident stress self-management program, including serving as the Designated Officer under the *Public Interest Disclosure (whistleblower protection) Act*, and co-chair of the Exceptional Situation Protocol Committee.

Also responsible for teaching values-based decision-making and moral reflection in various internal and external Catholic leadership programs, including board and sponsor education and formation. Role includes contract support to Covenant Care and Covenant Living for ethics consultation and leadership on mission-critical issues. Budget: Approximately \$ 5 million, 35 FTEs, and 5 direct reports.

Achievements:

- Developed and launched the *Ethics and Discernment Centre*, with public-facing resources, consultation, and education, to support thought-leadership locally and nationally;
- Developed and wrote an interactive learning app on the *Health Ethics Guide* which has been shared with Catholic health care colleagues across Canada, the US, and Australia. As part of this project, also developed similar modules for the Covenant Health board, leaders, and point of care staff;
- Developed policy and provided strategic leadership and operational oversight that successfully upheld the organization's Catholic identity in response to landmark national legislation enacted in June 2016 legally permitting voluntary euthanasia and assisted suicide in Canada (Medical Assistance in Dying). This involved negotiation with provincial funders, government authorities and regulatory bodies, physicians, bishops, sponsors, and other key internal and external stakeholders, including numerous media interviews;

- Represented both Covenant Health and the Catholic Health Alliance of Canada with appearances before the *Provincial Territorial Expert Advisory Group* and the *Federal Panel on Legislated Options* respectively in the wake of the Supreme Court of Canada ruling in February 2015 that struck down the Criminal Code prohibitions on assisted suicide and voluntary euthanasia. Also served as a Responder to a paper commissioned by the Alliance providing a moral analysis on the principle of cooperation regarding this issue;
- In 2014, led the national subcommittee on behalf of the Catholic Health Alliance of Canada in developing a national policy template to support Catholic partners in anticipation of the legalization of medical assistance in dying;
- Provided executive leadership with our benchmarking submissions to the Ethisphere® Institute, resulting in Covenant Health being designated among the *World's Most Ethical Companies™* successively in 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019;
- Served on the Canadian Reference Working Group for *Palliative Care Matters*, in identifying key questions addressed through the consensus development conference to advance palliative care in Canada;
- In consultation with Providence Health Care, the Government of Alberta, the Catholic Women's League and other community partners, co-led the establishment of the second set of *Angel Cradle* newborn safe havens in Canada at the Grey Nuns and Misericordia Community Hospitals, with extensive and ongoing media exposure;
- Developed the *Covenant Health Mission Discernment Tool*, which was recognized nationally as a Leading Practice by Accreditation Canada. Through use of the discernment tool, developed and implemented numerous ethically complex policy, for example, electronic monitoring and recording devices in the clinical setting, family presence during cardiopulmonary resuscitation, disclosure of wrongdoing, as well as guidelines for the use of cannabis;
- Serve on the Steering Committee and Roster of Advisors for the *Mission Collaboration Initiative* (MCI), developed to support Catholic ministries in Alberta by proactively address emerging issues through environment scanning, issues management and discernment, and advocacy. Led the first discernment on behalf of MCI.
- Developed a comprehensive set of metrics and assessment process for evaluating the organization's mission performance and setting annual mission targets, as part of our board and sponsor accountability for mission fidelity. The mission formation process was subsequently and fully integrated with the employee engagement cycle and renamed as the *Mission Inspired Culture* survey to better advance Covenant's People and Culture Strategy;

- Launched the Diversity and Inclusion Council, including the successful implementation of the Interpretive Services program to improve timely and accurate exchange of information at the point of care for the increasingly diverse patient/resident population we serve whose first language is not English;
- In partnership in St. Joseph's College, sponsored six competitive research grants in understanding the relationship of spirituality and health;
- Established the Covenant Health *Ethics Centre* to promote ethical leadership, capacity, learning and innovation;
- Developed Covenant Health's first code of conduct, *Our Commitment to Ethical Integrity*, and other related policy around conflict of interest and relationships with industry. Also co-authored Covenant's outsourcing and just workplace frameworks;
- Expanded the CISM and EFAP programs following the merger that formed Covenant Health to ensure quality organization-wide coverage to staff and physicians, with successful transition of the EFAP program and new provider to the Occupational Health and Wellness Program;
- At the request of the Board of Directors, developed theological reflection documents in support of Covenant Health's three strategic populations of emphasis, two of which were published in *Health Progress*;
- Profiled the organization's commitment to mission, ethics, values-based decision making and Catholic identity in peer reviewed publications, hosted conferences, national presentations, and site interdisciplinary lectures, as well as through a featured ethics column that ran monthly for three years in *Western Catholic Reporter*;
- Executive sponsor of the Catholic Sisters' Legacy Recognition Project, resulting in the establishment of a permanent statue on the Alberta Legislature grounds and a video celebrating the Sisters' historic contributions in Catholic health care, social services and education;
- Co-wrote and submitted a brief with the executive sponsor of Covenant Health's end-of-life strategy for the *Parliamentary Committee on Palliative and Compassionate Care*, and together appeared before the Committee on Parliament Hill.

The use of discernment also led to the development of our accommodating special requests policy, which was subsequently presented as evidence before Alberta's *Health Services Preferential Access Inquiry* in 2012;
- Provided ongoing administrative support and teaching responsibilities as faculty in the *Foundations in Leadership in Catholic Organizations* program, co-sponsored between Caritas Health Group and Providence Health Care (a partnership that continues today with Covenant Health and Emmanuel Care);
- Developed the Mission Awards Announcement Gala to enhance the profile and celebration of all mission award nominees, nominators, and award recipients;
- Drafted a pastoral letter on behalf of the Bishops of Alberta entitled, the *Saving Works of Catholic Healthcare*, as well as an ethics framework document for the Edmonton Catholic Agencies Network on VLT gaming;
- Served as a member and contributing author of the core team established by the Catholic Health Alliance of Canada to revise the new 2012 edition of the *Health Ethics Guide*;
- Served as co-facilitator of the *Caritas Leadership Program* (teaching responsibilities continue under the *Covenant Health Leadership Challenge Program*).
