Ottawa, April 25, 2016 - Ottawa Centre MPP Yasir Naqvi and Saint Paul University (SPU) held an event today to recognize the outstanding achievements of SPU alumna Dr. Patricia Marsden-Dole, recipient of the 2015 Ontario Senior Achievement Award.
