Title:	Financial Aid and Scholarships to Students

In this document, the masculine form is used without prejudice and for conciseness purposes only.

1. Objective

This regulation determines the different forms of financial aid and scholarships Saint Paul University provides to its registered students.

2. Regulation

2.1 Every type of student financial aid and scholarship must be approved by the Office of Admissions, Registrar and Student Services.

2.2 Undergraduate Admission Scholarships: Renewable admission scholarships for the entire duration of the program (usually 4 years) are offered to Canadian, permanent resident and international students from recognized high schools and colleges only, based on the following scale:

Average upon registration	Annual scholarship*	Total value
95 to 100%	\$3,500	\$14,000
90 to 94.9%	\$2,500	\$10,000
85 to 89.9%	\$1,500	\$6,000
80 to 84.9%	\$500	\$2,000

These scholarships are renewed automatically as long as the student is registered full-time and maintains a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 8.5.

Students applying to a certificate program or general BA program (3-year BA) are not eligible.

*Note: Saint Paul University's tuition fees for Canadian students are on average \$1,000 less per year than at other Ontario universities.

2.3 Second-Entry Programs: Renewable admission scholarships for the entire duration of the program (2 years for the Master of Theological Studies [M.T.S.] and 3 years for the Master of Theology [M.Th.]), are offered to Canadian, permanent resident and international students based on the following scale:

Average upon registration	Annual scholarship*	Total value
95 to 100%	\$3,500	\$7,000 (M.T.S.) / \$10,500 (M.Th.)
90 to 94.9%	\$2,500	\$5,000 (M.T.S.) / \$7,500 (M.Th.)
85 to 89.9%	\$1,500	\$3,000 (M.T.S.) / \$4,500 (M.Th.)
80 to 84.9%	\$500	\$1,000 (M.T.S.) / \$1,500 (M.Th.)

These scholarships are awarded automatically and are renewed automatically as long as the student is registered full-time and maintains a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 8.5.

*Note: Saint Paul University's tuition fees for Canadian students are on average \$1,000 less per year than at other Ontario universities.

- 2.4 Graduate Studies Admission Scholarships: Admission scholarships are offered to Canadian, permanent resident and international students with an average of at least 80% and who will be pursuing their studies full-time, based on the following scale:

Program	Duration and amount	Total value
Master's	6 terms × \$2,000	\$12,000
Doctorate	12 terms × \$2,500	\$30,000

These scholarships are automatically renewed for the normal duration of the program. Canadian citizens or permanent residents applying for a Graduate Diploma are also eligible for admission scholarships as long as they meet the conditions listed above. However, should they subsequently decide to pursue their studies at the Master's level, any funding received toward the Graduate Diploma will be deducted from the total scholarship amount for the Master's Degree.

Renewal criteria: Be continuously registered full-time and submit an Ontario Graduate Scholarship (OGS) application each year.

- 2.5 Designated Scholarships: Several scholarships with varying amounts and number each year, having specific conditions depending on the students' country of origin, marital or religious status, academic performance, and subject of academic research or study projects. These scholarships are awarded on competition, details of which are posted on the University website.
- 2.6 Financial Aid Bursaries: The criteria for awarding these bursaries are based primarily on the demonstrated financial need and the confirmed academic achievement of the student. The conditions for granting these bursaries are posted on the University website.
