

The Canadian Counselling and Psychotherapy Doctoral Dissertation Award *(Information valid seulement en anglais)*

The Canadian Counselling and Psychotherapy Association (CCPA) is a national bilingual association providing professional counsellors and psychotherapists with access to exclusive educational programs, certification, professional development, and direct contact with professional peers and specialty groups. The purpose of this scholarship is to recognize outstanding research and development that contributes to the profession of counselling and psychotherapy at the doctoral level.

Institution: The Canadian Counselling and Psychotherapy Association (CCPA)

Deadline: December 1st, 2019

Amount: \$500

Eligibility Criteria:

- The dissertation must be a part of the requirements of an accredited university for a doctoral degree specializing in counselling;
- The author must be a CCPA member in good standing;
- The dissertation must be completed and approved by the student's examining committee in one of the two calendar years preceding the award presentation.

To nominate:

- Submit a letter of intent including two letters of reference (one academic source, one other) outlining how the applicant meets assessment criteria. Referees must be familiar with the dissertation;
- Electronically submit one (1) complete copy of the dissertation as well as one (1) copy of the summary of not more than twenty (20) pages suitable for publication in a CCPA Publication (right to select for publication rests with the editor);
- Please indicate if and where this material with have been published by the following September.

General guidelines for assessment:

- Originality;
- Results & Findings: Impact for Counselling;
- Applicability & Importance of the work to counselling in Canada;
- Strengths & Limitations: Implications for Future Research;
- Writing style and overall quality of presentation.
