The purpose of the following award is to recognize the work of CCPA Master's Level Students.

Institution: The Canadian Counselling and Psychotherapy Association (CCPA)

Deadline: December 1st, 2019

Amount: \$450

Eligibility Criteria:

- The thesis must be part of the requirements of a recognized university for a Master's degree specializing in counselling;
- The author must be a CCPA student member in good standing;
- The thesis must be completed and approved by the student's examining committee in one of the two calendar years preceding the award presentation.

Application Process:

- Electronically submit one complete copy of the thesis;
- Submit one copy of the summary of not more than twenty pages suitable for publication in the CCPA Publication (right to select for publication rests with Editor);
- Please indicate if and where the material will have been published by the following September;
- Submit a letter of intent/purpose including a description of how the required criteria have been met;
- Submit two letters of recommendation/reference (one academic source, one other) outlining how the applicant meets assessment criteria. Referees must be familiar with the thesis.

General Guidelines for Assessment:

- Originality;
- Methodology;
- Writing style and overall quality of presentation;
- Strengths and limitations;
- Findings and results;
- Importance of the work to Counseling in Canada.
