

Canadian Hard of Hearing Association Scholarship Program *(Information valid seulement en Anglais)*

The Canadian Hard of Hearing Association (CCHA) Scholarship Program was established in 2002. This program is supported by donations of the members of the CHHA, Doreen Laszlo (spouse of Dr. Charles Laszlo), the CHHA: North Shore Branch and the CHHA: Newfoundland and Labrador Chapter. The mandate of CHHA is to encourage awareness to hearing loss and to advocate self-help for people with hearing loss. Its aim is to achieve full hearing accessibility in Canadian Society.

Institution: Canadian Hard of Hearing Association (CHHA)

Deadline: March 31st, 2019

Amount: \$1,000-\$2,000 (depending on which scholarship is chosen)

Eligibility Criteria:

- The applicants must be hard of hearing, deafened, or oral deaf with the premise that all applicants use spoken language as their primary means of communication;
- Applicants must be first-time or returning post-secondary students at a recognized college or university;
- Applicants must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents/landed immigrant, convention refugee or a protected person living in Canada;
- The field of study, year of program study, and location of residence may be a factor in the selection process for some scholarships;
- Mature students are encouraged to submit 2 academic transcripts when available or a minimum of 1 academic transcript and a statement (500 words or less) identifying the reason for the students' hiatus and return to school.
