

**Holocaust Remembrance Essay Award**

The Holocaust Remembrance Essay Award was funded initially from the proceeds of the conference, “The Holocaust Art/Politics/Law”, which was held at the Faculty of Law in October, 1997. The Award is currently funded through the generosity of Mr. Henry Wolfond of Toronto, a graduate of this Faculty.

**Deadline: July 1<sup>st</sup> (annually);**

**Amount: \$500;**

**Eligibility Criteria:**

- Essays must be original student work;
- Must have been composed in partial satisfaction of the requirements for an undergraduate or graduate degree in law at any law school in North America and overseas;
- Must be between 7,500 and 10,000 words in length, inclusive of reference;
- Must be accompanied by a letter of endorsement from the professor for whose course, or under whose direction, the essay was written;

**Application Process:**

- Essays must be on any topic, and concern any matter, provided only that they somehow address the relationship between law and the Holocaust;
- Particular welcome are essays which pursue the continuing significance of the Holocaust to law and human rights generally, and to the legal community and legal education in particular;
- The essay must be submitted in hardcopy or in electronic format, no later than July 1<sup>st</sup>;
- Essays may be submitted in French or in English.
