

## **Mattinson Scholarship for Students with Disabilities** *(Information disponible seulement en Anglais)*

Each year, member universities of Universities Canada are allowed to nominate one student each heading into the second or third year of a first bachelor's degree. The objective of this scholarship is to encourage Canadian students with permanent disabilities to pursue university studies with the ultimate objective of obtaining a first undergraduate degree.

**Deadline:** USUALLY LAUNCHES IN EARLY SPRING WITH A **MAY DEADLINE**;

**Amount:** \$2,000

### **Eligibility Criteria:**

- Must be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada;
- Be diagnosed with a permanent disability which is documented and is the primary disability for which they are applying (see link below for more information on what constitutes a permanent disability);
- Be in full-time studies;
- Have second or third year standing in a first bachelor degree program in September 2018;
- Have a minimum cumulative average of 80% (or equivalent) over the last 3 terms of available marks;
- Non-academic courses such as career or personal development related courses will be not be considered.

### **Application Process:**

- Must send nomination form to nominating university (in this case, Saint Paul University is the nominating university);
- If the committee elects your name, the following supporting documents need to be provided to Universities Canada;
- Letters of Reference;
- Letter of Reference (Academic);
- Letter of Reference (Extracurricular);
- Transcript.
