

**The National Union's Scholarship Program for 2019**

Each year, the 390,000-member National Union of Public and General Employees (NUPGE) offers 6 scholarships of \$1,500 each that reflect its pursuit of equal opportunity for workers. Entrants must be the children or grandchildren, or the foster children or the foster grandchildren, of members of retirees of the National Union's Component unions or its affiliates and who are planning to enter the 1<sup>st</sup> year of a Canadian public, post-secondary educational institution on a full-time basis on 2019.

All scholarships will be based on the best 750-1,000-word essay as listed below. Essays will be marked on the basis on content and style.

**Deadline: July 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019;**

**Amount: \$1,500;**

***Brian Fudge Memorial Scholarship***

Brian Fudge, the son of Derek Fudge and Jill Broadbent, and brother of Steve, graduated from John McRae High School in Ottawa in June 2001 and from the Police Foundations program at Humber College in Toronto in May 2004. On January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2005 Brian passed away after just having celebrated his 22<sup>nd</sup> birthday

Winner will be determined on the basis of a 750 to 1,000 word essay on: *“The importance on your field of study in either police, criminal justice, community or health care services in delivering public services to Canadians”*.

Eligibility Criteria: All those entering a field of study in **police, criminal justice, community or health care services** and who are children/grandchildren (including foster children/grandchildren) of National Union of Public and General Employees' current/retired members and who are planning to enter the 1<sup>st</sup> year of a Canadian public, post-secondary education institution full time in 2019/2020 are eligible to apply.
