I. FOREWORD

Sixteen years ago the National Archives of Canada published my *Guide to Documents Relating to French and British North America in the Archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" in Rome, 1622-1799* (Ottawa: National Archives of Canada / Archives nationales du Canada, 1991). That book, which was also published in French, was meant to be a printed introduction to a number of microfiches that included detailed descriptions to 2,441 documents of North American interest in the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" for the period from 1622 (the year of the establishment of Propaganda) and 1799 (a year that had been chosen simply because it marked the end of a century). All this material, in its various forms, was referred to as Finding Aid no. 1186 in the Reference Room of the National Archives of Canada.

At the time, much remained to be done in the Roman archives, but mainly thanks to the National Archives of Canada (now Library and Archives Canada) and the Centre de recherche en histoire religieuse du Canada of Université Saint-Paul, in Ottawa, and in particular of Victorin Chabot at the NAC and Pierre Hurtubise, OMI, at the CRHRC, together with the assistance of the Canadian Academic Centre in Italy (represented first by M. Roberto Perin and then by Egmont Lee), a team of researchers was put together that over the years surveyed in a systematic fashion most of the significant collections in the Roman archives for what pertains to the history of Canada to 1922 (the last year in which archival research and document consultation was allowed). These researchers, who over the years compiled a number of calendars and inventories, all of them currently available at the CRHRC and at the LAC in Ottawa, are Monique Benoit, Luigi Bruti-Liberati, Giovanni Pizzorusso, Matteo Sanfilippo, Gabriele P. Scardellato and Nicoletta Serio.

A major step forward was taken at the end of the the 1990s, when a research guide was published thanks to the financial assistance of the Gouvernement du Québec. This was edited by Luca Codignola, Pierre Hurtubise, OMI, and Fernand Harvey, and included several articles authored by Giovanni Pizzorusso and Matteo Sanfilippo, who were responsible for most of the actual research done in the 1990s and 2000s in the archives outside of the Propaganda, though they also worked in the archives of the Propaganda. This research guide was titled *L'Amérique du Nord française dans les archives religieuses de Rome 1600-1922. Guide de recherche* (Québec: Éditions de l'IQRS and Les Presses de l'Université Laval, 1999). The geographical scope of this new guide was limited, in that it only took into account what is now the province of Québec not the whole of present-day Canada, though it went back in time to the earliest days when North America was first settled by Europeans and Canada began its life as a French colony. In fact, however, the 1999 guide went well beyond such geographical borders, in that it followed French-speaking persons and individual relating to the history of Québec well beyond the political borders of the province -- into the Canadian West and the United States, for example. Furthermore, the structure of the guide was such that it provided any researcher -- even those interested in other geographical areas of the world -- with one of the best maps of the Roman historical archives, together with a full list of the finding aids as they were available in 1999 and the secondary literature in general.

As far as the archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" are concerned, other than this compiler's *Guide 1622-1799*, published in 1991, the years from 1846 to 1878 were covered by Giovanni Pizzorusso and Matteo Sanfilippo (*Inventaire des documents d'intérêt canadien dans les Archives de la Congrégation "de Propaganda Fide" sous le pontificat de Pie IX (1846-1878)* [Rome: Centre académique canadien en Italie, and Ottawa: Université Saint-Paul, 2001]); the years 1878 to 1903 by Monique Benoit (*Inventaire des principales séries de documents intéressants le*

Canada, sous le Pontificat de Léon XIII (1878-1903), dans les Archives de la Sacrée Congrégation "De Propaganda Fide" à Rome [Ottawa: Archives nationales du Canada, 1986]); and the years 1904 to 1914 by Giovanni Pizzorusso (*Inventaire des documents d'intérêt canadien dans les Archives de la Congrégation "de Propaganda Fide", 1904-1914* [Ottawa: Archives nationales du Canada, and Rome: Centre Académique Canadien, 1993]).

With regard to the archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide," one must also mention the fact that another, multi-volume calendar, was published by the American Academy of Franciscan History, a major on-going enterprise that began in 1966 with the publication of the first printed volume and that attained its thirteenth volume thirty years later. Anton Debeveč (1897-1987) was the first archivist employed by the Academy of American Franciscan History at the Propaganda (1954-84); he was followed, after his death, by archivist Giovanna Piscini (Finbar Kenneally, OFM, [ed.], *United States Documents in the Propaganda Fide Archives. A Calendar. First Series* [Washington, DC: Academy of American Franciscan History, 1966-81, 7 vols. and Index]; Anton Debeveč, Mathias C. Kiemen, OFM, Alexander Wyse, OFM, James McManamon, OFM, William J. Short, OFM, and Giovanna Piscini, eds., *United States Documents in the Propaganda Fide Archives. Second Series. A Calendar* [Washington, DC: Academy of American Franciscan History, 1980-2006, 6 vols. to date]). Although the Franciscan *Calendar* only deals with the United States in their present-day borders and the editors consistently expunged references to documents, persons, and event not strictly related to American matters, several documents of Canadian interest appear in it. In fact, the Franciscan *Calendar* remains to this day the most useful finding aid for researchers interested in Canada in periods or series not yet covered by the above-mentioned guides, inventories, and calendars.

As regards the period 1800-46, which so far has not been covered by the any guide, calendar or inventory specifically aiming at documents of Canadian interest, this *Calendar 1800-46* represents a major step forward. This compiler began to work on this new project in 1988, that is, as soon as the *Calendar 1622-1799* was finished. (It was eventually published in book form in 1991.) In 1993 he first produced a calendar devoted to the years 1800-30 which was made available in microform (*Vatican. Archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide", Finding Aid no. 1186, Calendar of Documents Relating to Canada in the Archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" in Rome, 1800-30*, Ottawa: National Archives of Canada, 1993). This was subsequently merged with the previous *Guide 1622-1799* in a CD-ROM that also contained other documentary material (*ArchiVIA 4. Colonial Archives. Findings Aids on CD-ROM/ Archives coloniales. Instruments de recherche sur CD-ROM* [Ottawa: National Archives of Canada / Archives Nationales du Canada, 1996]). A few years later, a preliminary calendar relating to the years 1831-46 also became available in microform (*Vatican. Archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide", Finding Aid no. 1186, Calendar of Documents Relating to Canada in the Archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" in Rome, 1831-46* [Ottawa: National Archives of Canada, 2001]).

This *Calendar 1800-46* finally merges the above-mentioned calendars relating respectively to 1800-30 and 1831-46 in a single work. In using this new *Calendar 1800-46*, however, some words of caution must be added. First of all, the numbering system of the previous two preliminary calendars was maintained, so that each volume of this *Calendar 1800-46* consists of two parts, each with its numbering system. Secondly, not all archival series were fully examined, as it will be shown in detail in Ch. V. In general terms, suffice here to say that vol. 4 (Varia and Addenda) stops in 1830

(so that it does not have a Part 2); that the Lettere series was examined only to 1839; that the Udienze series was examined only to 1830; finally, that the Congressi series was examined only to 1830, except for the sub-series America Settentrionale, which was carried on to 1835. It is to be hoped that these gaps that still apply to the period 1831-46 will soon be filled by new research.

II. THIS CALENDAR 1800-46

The Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" was officially established by Pope Gregory XV on 22 June 1622 with the bull *Inscrutabili divinae providentiae*. Propaganda was founded to spread the true Faith among the infidels, to protect it were Catholics lived side by side with non-Catholics, and ultimately to achieve union with the Protestant and the Orthodox churches. The new Sacred Congregation was meant to pursue these goals by coordinating all missionary activities and centralizing information on foreign lands. Propaganda as first housed in the Vatican palaces, then the palace of the Cancelleria Apostolica, then in a palace overlooking present-day piazza Mignanelli, close to piazza di Spagna, until they were transferred to the Università Urbaniana campus, close to the Vatican but not within the Vatican walls, at via Urbano VIII 16/17, 00165 Roma.

From the very beginning, North America came under the jurisdiction of Propaganda. It was only with the bull *Sapienti consilio*, issued by Pope Pius X on 29 June 1908, that the United States and Canada were withdrawn from the jurisdiction of the Sacred Congregation, together with Newfoundland, Great Britain, Scotland, Holland and Luxembourg. From 1622 until 1893 very little changed in the working habits of the Propaganda officials. In 1893, the archival system was reformed. For an extensive treatment of the founding of Propaganda, its establishment and jurisdiction, its archivists and historians, the reader is referred to the *Guide 1622-1799*, pp. 25-61.

This *Calendar 1800-46* contains description of 2,941 documents preserved in different series of the archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide." The following table provides a checklist of the number of documents calendared with regard to the years 1622-1846 and their distribution in the *Guide 1622-1799* and the two parts of *Calendar 1800-46*.

In all, 776 archival volumes were examined and are described in the *Calendar 1800-46*; of them, 482 had already been examined for the 1622-1799 period and are described in *Guide 1622-1799*, as shown in the following table.

Entries summarize the content of all the documents with respect to facts and individual in British North America between 1800 and 1846. The scope of this *Calendar 1800-46*, however, requires further explanation as regards its difference with the previous *Guide 1622-1799*.

The *Guide 1622-1799* described all documents dealing with the whole of French and British North America, that is, whatever is now the United States and Canada, except the Spanish-speaking regions of the future United States. It also described all documents dealing with persons that had, at some point in their life, spent some time in or were simply connected to either country. Furthermore, the compiler had tried to give the widest possible scope to his work and to bear in mind the many facets of the research and the variety of uses to which it might be put. He had therefore not restricted himself to those documents explicitly mentioning North America (however briefly) or having a direct bearing on the history of North America, but has also taken into consideration documents that did not refer specifically to North America. His view encompassed those documents that may have in some way influenced the North American policy of Propaganda; which indicated the depth of knowledge of North American affairs on the party of Propaganda officials; and that demonstrate the possibility of errors and mistaken geographical attributions on their part. In order to be as inclusive as possible, the compiler had chosen not to extrapolate individual documents dealing with North America from the files (a group of documents showing some kind of unity), but to calendar all files in their entirety. (These files were called "dossiers" in the *Calendar 1622-1799*.) To preserve the unity of individual files, this compiler had kept them intact in all parts, thus cataloguing items not in

themselves concerned with North America. This same method applied to the treatment of individuals. Anyone having anything to do with the history of French and British North America between 1622 and 1799 had been included in the *Guide 1622-1799*. In some cases, the importance of an individual who lived principally in North America had led this compiler to include entries concerning documentary material that did not strictly relate to that area. There was then the problem of individuals who had continual dealings with North America but never set foot on the continent; or of those who tried to go but appear never to have gotten there; or of those who were thought to be in North America but were in fact elsewhere. They too were included in the *Guide 1622-1799*, though only when the documents in question were somewhat related to North America.

The same inclusive criteria were used with regard to the *Calendar 1800-46*, except that its geographical scope was narrowed down from to the whole of French and British North America to the political entity that was then known as British North America (in practice, every location that was not part of the United States), and that today we refer to as Canada. But, once again, all persons who spent some time in British North America or were simply connected with it are somewhat followed even when were still in Europe or had left for other places, such as the United States or the West Indies. Moreover, Saint-Pierre and Miquelon, the archipelago that was never either a British North American or an appendage of the United States, is considered as part of a larger North Atlantic world and home to many Acadians, and as such it is included in this *Calendar 1800-46*.

Finally, researchers must note that, whereas the *Guide 1622-1799*, covered all the documents of the archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" for the period concerned, the same cannot be claimed for this *Calendar 1800-46*. There are in fact some series that were only partially calendared and that must still be examined. The following table is a checklist of series and archival volumes that have only partially been examined, especially with regard to the period 1831-46, or not examined at all. (Full details are available in Ch. 5, "List of Archival Series and Volumes Consulted.")

III. ABBREVIATIONS, SYMBOLS, AND ESSENTIAL GLOSSARY

One of the technical differences between the *Guide 1622-1799* and this *Calendar 1800-46* is the very limited number of abbreviations or symbols used in the latter's descriptions. The entries in the *Guide* were replete with abbreviations, something that made at times for some complicated reading, especially at first glance. Then, the real reason behind such an abundant use of abbreviations and symbols was the necessity to keep descriptions to a minimum in order to save space on the final written page, and consequently the number of pages that would have made up the final printed volumes. What was true in the mid-1970s, however, when this project began, was not true in the mid-1990s, when digital files produced through laptop computers were almost universally replacing printed forms meant to be filled by pen or pencil (and eventually a typewriter) in archival repositories throughout the world. This shift from printed forms to digital files made it possible not only to produce longer descriptions of individual documents, but also to make those descriptions more user friendly by avoiding abbreviations and symbols than until then had been such a typical instrument of the archivist's trade. Only very few abbreviations, then, were used in the *Calendar 1800-46*. A good number of these abbreviations are in fact ecclesiastical acronyms, denoting the affiliation of an individual priest or nun to a regular (or religious) order, as opposed to his being simply a secular (or diocesan) priest. These acronyms are in fact commonly used to this day, and simplify the reference to an order or a congregation that, in its expanded forms, might have a number of regional, national, and linguistic variations. The following is the list of abbreviations and symbols used in the *Calendar 1800-46*, compounded with a glossary of terms that are sometime not self-evident in their meaning or might require further specification.

IV. HOW TO USE A STANDARD ENTRY OF THIS CALENDAR

In this *Calendar 1800-46*, each entry has been standardized to allow for the easier use of the search function in and better to regroup information of the same nature. Some elements are more technical (entry number, series, volume, folios, language, type of document; other element are more historical (author, recipient, location, date, description remarks). The description is the core element of each entry.

1. Entry number

In the *Calendar 1800-46*, each entry has been assigned a specific number which indicates the location of a certain item within the corresponding volume of the *Calendar*. When looking for any item, the volume number and the entry number must be specified (in this *Calendar 1800-46*, the entry number must always consist of three digits). Furthermore, since each volume of the *Calendar 1800-46* consists of two parts (*Cal. 1800-30* and *Cal. 1831-46*), each with its own numbering system, whether the entry belongs to the former or to the latter must also be specified. For example, when looking for entry no. 161 of the series *Lettere* for the period 1800-30, the following formula must be used: *Cal. 1800-30 V 161* -- that is --

- *Calendar*
- first part (covering the years 1800-30)
- vol. 5 (containing the entries relating to the *Lettere* series)
- 161 (entry no. 161)

Because each volume of the *Calendar 1800-46* contains one archival series only, the above method is rather self-evident. In this respect, however, volume 4 of the *Calendar* is exceptional, in that it regroups all entries that describe documents taken from several, "minor" series. The numbering system, however, remains the same. Then *Cal. 1800-30 IV 379* indicates

- *Calendar*
- first part (covering the years 1800-30)
- vol. 4 (which contains entries taken from several "minor series," besides a short section of "addenda")
- 279 (entry no. 279)

Note that this entry number applies to the *Calendar 1800-46* only. Because it has no archival meaning whatsoever, it should not be used when asking for a document in the archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide."

2. Series

For each entry, the original archival series and, when applicable, sub-series are specified. As noted above, each volume of the *Calendar* contains one archival series only, except for vol. 4, which regroups entries that describe documents taken from several, "minor" series, besides some entries relating to documents that had been overlooked in the *Guide 1622-1799* ("Addenda"). The names of the series and, only for the *Congressi* series, the sub-series are essential elements to identify archival documents, together with the number of the archival volume.

3. Volume

For each entry, the number of the archival volume in which the original document is included is given. This is often followed by the year or years the volume covers. In some cases, the time span indicated for a volume corresponds only vaguely to the year or years covered by the records. The number of the archival volume is an essential element to identify archival documents, together with the name of the archival series, whereas the year or years covered by the archival volume are not.

4. Folios

The volume number is followed by all folios (or, more rarely, pages) of which the calendared document consists. Blank pages are considered part of a document. For example, "ff. 99rv-100rv" means that the document consists of folios 99 and 100. On the other hand, "ff. 109rv, 112rv" means that the document consists of folios 109 and 112, but that folios 110 and 111 belong to another document. In the case of series where no incoming documents are preserved, and that are mostly registers of copyletter books (such as Acta, Lettere, Decreti, etc.), a document may consist of a portion of a folio only. For example, "ff. 82v-83r" means that the document appears on the verso of folio 82 and on the recto of folio 83, but that the recto of folio 82 and the verso of folio 83 are another document. Folio (or page) numbers are necessary to locate the document within a selected volume, but need not be specified when asking for a certain volume in the archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide."

One should be aware that, although documents are normally bound in volumes, and as such are unlikely to be moved from their original location, the numbering of folios and pages is still an ongoing process. In the best of instances, each folio is stamped on its recto by a progressive number, and this numbering include all blank folios. But this system is far from common. In most cases, folios were numbered in ink, several folios were overlooked in the process, and usually no folio that had remained blank or had very little written on it was numbered. This made it necessary for this compiler to add a system of letters, in brackets, after the official folio number, to indicate more precisely the extent of the documents and the location of its features: for example ff. 5[a]rv-f.5[d]rv; or ff. 10[a]rv-12[b]rv. In the future, when all the folios are be properly stamped, these folio numbers will also change.

5. Language

Next, the language used in the document is shown. In the case of incoming and outgoing documents pertaining to North America, Latin, Italian, French and English are the languages used in the years from 1800 to 1846. Translations from French and English into Italian were normally prepared by the *minutanti* or by the foreign clergy's agents residing in Rome for circulation among the officials of Propaganda. Some of these translations are still attached to the original documents. Sometimes, only the translation has survived. Roman officials insisted that Latin be the language used by the North American bishops, but the latter complied only partially, some adducing a poor knowledge of this language. Most of the Propaganda's outgoing documents were written in Italian or Latin, although occasionally there are letters in French and English. Although the core of the document is usually in one language only, often notes were scribbled on the original document or quotations were made that were in another language. Sometimes a single entry may consist of up to three different

languages.

6. Location

One must note, first of all, that information about location, date, author (writer) and recipient (addressee) is seldom complete, and that details lacking in the original document have been supplemented by this compiler whenever possible.

This piece of information specifies the location in which the document was actually drafted. In the case of series where no incoming documents are preserved and are mostly registers of copyletter books (such as Acta, Lettere, Decreti, etc.), the location is almost invariably Rome, although this is very rarely specified.

7. Date

In the case of a letter received or sent, the date is normally provided by the author of the letter. Some documents, however, are more complicated and requires further specifications. For example, authors of letters sometime copied out entire documents; some documents that belonged to times past were later copied and certified, the copier appending his own name and the date in which the certification had taken place; other documents were translated, with translations being dated and signed by the translator itself. Whenever it was possible to do so, this compiler has kept the unity of the original document (which then corresponds to a single archival piece and an individual entry in the *Calendar 1800-46*), but he has attempted to separate its several components by numbering them separately. The same entry, then, might show several dates, the latest one being normally the unifying one. All documents in this *Calendar 1800-46* are dated according to the New Style calendar. On the style used for dates, see below, under Description.

8. Author, Recipient

These two pieces of information show the names of the actual author (writer) of the document in question, and of its recipient (addressee). In the case of series where no incoming documents are preserved and that are mostly registers of copyletter books (such as Acta, Lettere, Decreti, etc.), the actual name of the author is very seldom made explicit. This compiler has attempted to discover in each case who actually was the author, but, whenever that was not possible, a more general indication, such as "Sacred Congregation 'de Propaganda Fide,'" is given between square brackets. Very seldom do names appear in their complete form, that is, first name and surname, ecclesiastical title, and capacity, such as, for example, "Edmund Burke, bishop of Sion, vicar apostolic in Halifax;" or "Carlo Maria Pedicini, cardinal, prefect of the Sacred Congregation 'de Propaganda Fide.'" A great effort has been made, throughout the *Calendar 1800-46*, to identify all authors and recipients and to provide for them their precise title and capacity at the time the document in question was written.

The reader, however, should be aware that, owing to the fact that this *Calendar 1800-46* was many years in the making, inconsistencies with regard to the actual use of names and capacities are evident. Whereas, in principle, it should have been made clear right from the beginning what

information was provided by the document itself and what information was supplemented by this compiler, this was not always done. A perfect entry, for example, would have had "J.O., bishop of Québec" followed by "[Joseph-Octave Plessis, archbishop of Québec]." This distinction, however, is sometimes unavailable. Indeed, it would have been impossible and in fact a waste of time to go back to the original document to verify this point. This inconsistency with proper names also applies to names as they appear in the Description of documents (see below), as most documents refer to persons in an inconsistent way. It was this compiler's choice to provide first names and surnames for all people mentioned (whenever that was possible) on each mention even within the same document, even though the document itself might have provided only some partial information or none whatsoever. The reference might have been, for example, to "the superior of the Séminaire de Québec," or to "the bishop of Boston." The reader might rest assured, however, that whenever the added information on a particular person is dubious or uncertain, this is clearly noted by a question mark.

9. Type of Document

This is where the distinction is made between an autograph letter signed, a letter in another hand signed, a copy, a copy signed, a printed matter, etc. Whenever a document does not take the form of a written matter sent to one or more specific persons, this compiler has normally used the formula "memorandum."

10. Description

This element fully describes the contents of the document. Here too, the reader will note some inconsistencies that, as explained above (Author, Recipient), derive from the fact that this *Calendar 1800-46* was many years in the making and not all series have been uniformly approached. By and large, documents for the period 1800-30 were all very thoroughly described. Documents for the period 1831-46, on the contrary, vary. Shorter descriptions were used for the Acta series (vol. 2) and the SOCG series (vol. 3). Longer descriptions, conversely, were used for the Lettere series (vol. 5) and the Congressi series (vol. 6). Inconsistencies with regard to the actual use of names and capacities, as explained above, also apply to the description.

An effort has been made to identify individuals, facts, places and dates when they are not in the original documents, which is most often the case. Obviously, this was not always possible. Everything between square brackets belongs to the compiler, and everything else is in the original document. Aside from names, additional information is also given between square brackets when it offers data that are not in the original document but that this compiler considers to be necessary or of particular significance. In the longer description, the compiler has also specified the presence of marginal notes, usually in the hand of an official of Propaganda; or additional notes or comments on the matter in question; or a summary of the gist of the document, usually prepared by a minor official of the Propaganda; the reference to a letter of answer or to other documents; and the decision made on the issue (called *rescriptum*).

In general, an effort has been made to be consistent with regard not only with names of persons, but also with institutions and events, well knowing that users of this *Calendar 1800-46*, at least on their

first approach, are more likely to search for keywords rather than to actually "read" one entry after another. Thus, no matter in which form they appear on the original document, the rule of the thumb has been always to use the same formula to indicate the same matter, whether in simple form or in brackets. This compiler felt that readers would appreciate the confidence with which they can use their search functions, although this may sometimes appear cumbersome and repetitive, with the same formula repeated over and over even within the same description. In this perspective, here are some simplifications there were made in the descriptions for the sake of consistency:

- "government" and "crown" are always rendered as "crown"
- British and English are used interchangeably, and often reflect the original use of the adjective
- lower case was used consistently (pope, governor, etc., except for proper names)
- "governor" has been consistently used as a simplified version of various types of governorships (lieutenant-governor, governor-in-chief, etc.)
- throughout the *Calendar 1800-46*, all dates have been used according to the following formula: "11 feb 1812," "01 jul 1835," "00 aug 1839," or "00 000 1846." In fact, the quickest way to look for a fact or a document is to refer to the presumed or known date of the document. When "00" for a day or "000" for a month is used, it is, of course, because that piece of information is as yet unknown. When the document itself does not have a precise date, this was supplied in square brackets immediately thereafter.
- some institutions are always given according to the same formula, irrespective of how they appear in the original document. Mostly evidently, this system was used with the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide," the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office, the Séminaire de Saint Sulpice of Paris, the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal and the Séminaire de Québec.

Finally, whenever any document touches upon matters other than Canadian (or properly, British North American), this is clearly indicated at the end of the description. In some cases, documents that are described as dealing with the United States only, or with Ireland, etc., are listed, simply because they were part of files that also had a Canadian component. When these files were too large and the listing of all documents herein contained would have been too time- or space-consuming, this is clearly indicated in the Remarks.

11. Remarks

In the last section of each entry, general details on the documents are given, such as their forming part of a larger file (hence the cross-references to other documents described in the *Guide 1622-1799* and to this *Calendar 1800-46*), the existence of enclosures, of other copies, of translations, of erroneous pagination, etc. The same inconsistency noted above with regard to names applies to cross-references. These were consistently given for the period 1800-30, less so for the subsequent period 1831-46.

V. LIST OF ARCHIVAL SERIES AND VOLUMES CONSULTED

The following is the list of archival series and volume series consulted in preparation for this *Calendar 1800-46*. The reader must refer to the *Guide 1622-1799*, pp. 29-39, for an analytical description of each series. The short introductions to each series that are to be found below are simply meant to illustrate some features that mostly apply to the years 1800-46.

The reader must be aware that what follows is not a complete inventory of the archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide," for which we refer to Nikolaus Kowalsky, OMI, and Josef Metzler, OMI, *Inventory of the Historical Archives of the Sacred Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples of "de Propaganda Fide." New Enlarged Edition*, Rome: Pontificia Universitas Urbaniana, 1983. The following is, instead, an inventory of the series and sub-series that were selected for the special purpose of this *Calendar 1800-46* within its chronological and geographical scope.

The short introductions to each series or sub-series include an indication of the volumes that remain to be examined to complete the period 1800-46. Vol. 4 of the *Calendar 1800-46* has been compiled only with regard to the period 1800-30; the period 1831-46 remains to be done. Furthermore, within the Congressi series, some sub-series are also mentioned that have been overlooked both in Codignola *Guide 1622-1799* and in this *Calendar 1800-46*, but that, in the light of new research done in recent years, are now believed to contain documents of interest for the chronological and geographical scope of this *Calendar 1800-46*.

1. Acta series

Vols. 1-167 are in strict chronological order, from 1616 to 1799, and were examined and described in the *Guide 1622-1799*. Vols. 168-209 pertain to the years 1800-46 and were fully described in this *Calendar 1800-46*, vol. 2. This series contains the proceedings of the general congregations. This may be singled out as the most important of all series, not because of the documents it contains (in fact there are very few "original" incoming documents in this series), but because it provides the key to an understanding of Propaganda and its activities.

2. Scritture Originali riferite nelle Congregazioni Generali (SOCG) series

Vols. 1-906 were examined and described in *Codignola, Guide 1622-1799*. Vols. 1-381, once improperly referred to as "Lettere Antiche," and vols. 382-417, once improperly referred to as "Memoriali," were organized thematically. Vols. 418-906 are in strict chronological order, from 1669 to 1797. Vols. 907-968 pertain to the years 1800-46 and are fully described in this *Calendar 1800-46*, vol. 3. 11. Lettere series

Vols. 1-278 are in strict chronological order and were examined and described in the *Guide 1622-1799*. Vols. 277-278 were re-examined and described in this *Calendar 1800-46*, together with vols. 279-322, and were fully described in this *Calendar 1800-46*, vol. 5. This series contains the copies of letters written by the prefect and the secretary of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" and sent to their correspondents around the world. The Lettere series does not contain original incoming documents, but, together with Acta, it provides perhaps the best key to the understanding

of the everyday working of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide, in that issues discussed both in the "congregazioni generali" and in the "congressi" were communicated to their addressee via letters, whose copies were then filed in the Lettere series. Vols. 323-334 remain to be examined. They deal with the years 1840-6.
