O'Donel [James Louis O'Donel], bishop of Thyatira and vicar apostolic in Newfoundland, informed [in his letter to James Thomas Troy of 15 jul 1804; see Cal. 1800-30 III 007] that he has lived for more than 20 years in his mission [since 1784], but has suffered a stroke [in 1804], is tired, and needs a coadjutor. When he arrived in the island, Catholics were only 15; they are now 15,000. He is willing to accept the person recommended by Troy [John Thomas Troy], archbishop of Dublin. In his letter to Concanen [Richard Luke Concanen] of 21 sep [21 sep 1804; see Cal. 1800-30 III 002], Troy [John Thomas Troy] mentioned three candidates, namely, Brady [Bernard Brady], Stewart [Bonaventure Stewart] and Lambert [Patrick Lambert]. Joseph-Octave Plessis asks to be permitted to charge small fees from everybody, not only from the wealthy, on the understanding that money will always be used for pious purposes. As for the appointment of new bishops in Canada [British North America], the writer recalls that the letter of Castlereagh [Robert Stewart, Viscount Castlereagh] to Ercole Consalvi [of 30 apr 1817; see Cal. 1800-30 III 066] suggested Edmund Burke, McDonell [Alexander McDonell], and MacEachern [Angus Bernard MacEachern]. According to Joseph-Octave Plessis, Alexander McDonell should be appointed vicar apostolic in Kingston, Angus Bernard MacEachern vicar apostolic in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island (with jurisdiction over New Brunswick and Îles-de-la-Madeleine). However, Joseph-Octave Plessis recalled that Edmund Burke's appointment as vicar apostolic in Nova Scotia [on 19 may 1817] did not improve the state of religion in the province. Joseph-Octave Plessis also favoured the erection of an archbishopric in Québec, and announced that a new and immense territory had recently been discovered in the Northwest, where he had just sent a missionary [Pierre-Antoine Tabeau]. Items 1-3 of the Sommario are the royal appointment of Joseph-Octave Plessis to the bishopric of Québec, Joseph-Octave Plessis's counterproposal, and Joseph-Octave Plessis's revised proposal such as it was sent to London.

The general congregation of 23 nov 1818 [see Cal. 1800-30 II 039] and the letter of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" [i.e., Francesco Fontana's] to the bishop of Québec, Joseph-Octave Plessis, of 13 mar 1819 [see Cal. 1800-30 V 076] (item 1 of Sommario) are recalled. Before receiving that letter, the bishop [Joseph-Octave Plessis] went to England and then to Rome, where he currently is. A plan submitted by the bishop [Joseph-Octave Plessis], dated 20 aug 1819, requesting four vicars apostolic [see Cal. 1800-30 IV 361] (item 2 of Sommario) was approved by Henry Bathurst on 15 sep 1819 [see Cal. 1800-30 IV 360] (item 3 of Sommario). The vicar apostolic in the London district, William Poynter, was written to on 02 oct 1819 [see Cal. 1800-30 V 084] (item 4 of Sommario) re the erection of the archbishopric of Québec, to which the governor [Charles Lennox, governor of British North America] is opposed. Joseph-Octave Plessis has now explained his plan for Canada [i.e., British North America, in his memorandum of 17 nov 1819; see Cal. 1800-30 IV 362]. Canada [British North America] consists of all lands bordering on the vicariates apostolic in Newfoundland and in the United States, the Arctic Pole and the Pacific Ocean, with 500,000 Catholics, of whom 450,000 are in Lower Canada. For such an immense territory the two appointed bishops [Alexander McDonell, Angus Bernard MacEachern] are not sufficient. Joseph-Octave Plessis suggests that the bishopric of Québec be subdivided into five parts, each with a vicar general with episcopal title, under the jurisdiction of the bishop of Québec, namely, [1] Québec, Trois-Rivières, Gaspé (200,000 Catholics), under the bishop of Québec himself; [2] Montréal (200,000), under Jean-Jacques Lartigue, 40, a Canadian [Lower Canadian] priest; [3] Upper Canada (15,000), under Alexander McDonell; [4] New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Îles-de-la-Madeleine, Cape Breton Island (10,000), under Angus Bernard MacEachern; upon Edmund Burke's death, Nova Scotia (8,000) should be attached to Angus Bernard MacEachern's vicariate; [5] Hudson Bay, James Bay, the North, to the Rocky Mountains (3,000/4,000), under Joseph-Norbert Provencher, 32, a Canadian [Lower Canadian] missionary who has lived there for two years [1818-20]. As for the land west of the Rocky Mountains, it has not been civilized yet, and it is inhabited by ferocious and nomadic peoples [Indians]; Russia and California are in a better position to provide it with missionaries. Joseph-Octave Plessis asks that briefs be sent for Jean-Jacques Lartigue and Joseph-Norbert Provencher, and promises to answer the queries concerning his own appointment to the Legislative Council [of Lower Canada; see Cal. 1800-30 V 076] as soon as he returns to Canada [Lower Canada]. Patrick Lambert, bishop of Chytri and former vicar apostolic in Newfoundland, is currently in Ireland, ill with epilexy, but the writer has 10 assistants [Timothy Browne, Andrew V. Cleary, Nicholas Devereux, Thomas Anthony Ewer, Alexander FitzGerald, William Herron, Dennis Makin, John Power d.1823, James Sinnott, William Whitty]. The best among them is Timothy Browne, an Irish Augustinian who has already spent eight years in the island [*c.* 16 oct 1811-15 oct 1819]; unfortunately, Timothy Browne's provincial is trying to have him recalled to Ireland. The writer also calls for a reduction of holidays, on a par with that granted to the diocese of Québec, since most of his faithful are engaged in the fishing industry and simply cannot observe them. He also reports on his nov-jul [00 jul 1823-00 oct 1823] visitation around Prince Edward Island, where he has two priests, the Scot Donald Macdonald [Bernard Donald Macdonald] and the Irish Alexander Fitzgerald. He is trying to build a church in St. Andrew's, has no difficulties with the Calvinists, and penal laws are not enforced. The writer describes the difficulties caused by language problems. The bishop of Canada [recte Joseph-Octave Plessis, archbishop of Québec in Lower Canada] and his missionaries have no knowledge of Celtic [i.e., Gaelic] and English nor are they acquainted with Scottish or Irish institutions. In fact, the visitation performed by the bishop [Joseph-Octave Plessis] in 1812 to Prince Edward Island was the first since the Conquest [Capitulation of Montréal, 08 sep 1760]; there a priest must know English, French and Celtic [i.e., Gaelic]. In that period, only two Scottish priests were educated [in Québec, Bernard Donald Macdonald, Ronald Macdonald], one of whom is currently in Cape Breton Island [Bernard Donald Macdonald], the other still in Canada [Lower Canada].

To date, all Scottish missionaries who preached in Nova Scotia and Cape Breton Island were sent from the Scottish Highlands, eight of whom accompanied emigrants. The writer suggests that the new vicar apostolic in Nova Scotia be William Fraser, a missionary fluent in Celtic [i.e., Gaelic] and English, with experience in the Scottish Highlands, in Cape Breton Island (the writer's companion of the previous year [1823]), currently in Nova Scotia. The vicar apostolic, bishop of Arindela [Reginald MacDonald, bishop of Arindela, vicar apostolic in the Highland district of Scotland], must be consulted on the candidate. A letter from the archbishop of Québec [Joseph-Octave Plessis] to the writer of 12 jan 1824 is profusely quoted. The general congregation of 23 sep 1817 [see Cal. 1800-30 II 035] deferred a new subdivision of the diocese, yet Joseph-Octave Plessis was appointed archbishop in the general congregation of 23 nov 1818 [see Cal. 1800-30 II 039]. At the same time, McDonell [Alexander McDonell] and MacEachern [Angus Bernard MacEachern] were appointed vicars general, suffragan and auxiliary bishops respectively in Upper Canada and in Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Îles-dela-Madeleine. When Lord Bathurst, the colonial minister [Henry Bathurst, secretary of state for War and the Colonies], complained about Joseph-Octave Plessis's new title, the general congregation of 24 jan 1820 [see Cal. 1800-30 II 046] allowed him not to use it, at the same time appointing Jean-Jacques Lartigue and Joseph-Norbert Provencher vicars general, suffragan and auxiliary bishops respectively in Montréal and in the North, while Cape Breton [Cape Breton Island] was attached to Angus Bernard MacEachern's jurisdiction. Later, the general congregation of 24 feb 1823 [see Cal. 1800-30 II 111], ruled out the erection of new bishoprics which had been suggested by Jean-Jacques Lartigue in 1821 and Angus Bernard MacEachern [in his letter of 09 nov 1819; see Cal. 1800-30 III 256], on account of the British crown's opposition, although the latter was mainly aimed at the appointment of an archbishop. In mar [00 mar 1825] Alexander McDonell went to Rome to ask for the erection of a bishopric in Upper Canada. Joseph-Octave Plessis's letter to William Poynter of 29 aug 1824 [in Cal. 1800-30 III 288] is transcribed, which shows that the crown is not opposed to the erection of the new bishopric. William Poynter, who had forwarded it to Robert Gradwell, rector of the English College in Rome and his own procurator, on 02 nov 1824 [in Cal. 1800-30 III 288], mentioned the new Protestant bishop, Stuart [recte Charles James Stewart, Church of England bishop of Québec], and the fact that Henry Bathurst, who knows that Alexander McDonell is "absolutely necessary to keep good order in Upper Canada," has disbursed in the past "large amounts of money" to him and has recently paid all his back dues. To the letter of the pro-prefect of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" [Giulio Maria Della Somaglia] of 27 nov [27 nov 1824; see Cal. 1800-30 V 177], William Poynter answered on 21 dec [21 dec 1824] (Sommario, no. 1 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 292]), and again on 8 feb [08 feb 1825] (Sommario, no. 2 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 290]), repeating that Henry Bathurst is not opposed to the erection of the new bishopric, but has asked the opinion of the Governor [George Ramsay Dalhousie, governor of British North America]. When Alexander McDonell arrived in Rome, on 25 mar 1825 he was asked to state his case in writing. Alexander McDonell did so in his memorandum [of 00 apr 1825] (Sommario, no. 3 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 287]). Reference to Joseph-Octave Plessis's letter of 29 aug 1824 (Sommario, no. 4). In his memorandum, Alexander McDonell, who does not seem to be current with some British political affairs, describes births, emigration from Scotland and Ireland, conversions, revenues of the future bishopric, a seminary being built, seven churches (there were two [in 1804]), seven priests (one in 1804), one student in Québec, four or five students with the Sulpician Seminary of Montreal. The new bishopric will establish its see in Kingston, and a slight change of borders will be necessary. According to the writer, Joseph-Octave Plessis's letters to William Poynter of 29 aug 1824 and of 28 oct 1824 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 289] show that he is in favour of the erection of a new bishopric, although it is unclear whether Alexander McDonell is his candidate for the position. The bishop fears that Upper Canada will experience the same difficulties of Nova Scotia, where, after Edmund Burke's appointment [as vicar apostolic in the general congregation of 19 aug 1817; see Cal. 1800-30 II 033], Canadian [Lower Canadian] priests left, only few second-rate European priests arrived, the Scots and the Irish were not provided for, the Acadian and Indian missions were abandoned, and the vacancy that followed Edmund Burke's death [on 29 nov 1820] continues to this date. The four queries are: [1] whether to erect the bishopric of Upper Canada and appoint Alexander McDonell; [2] where to establish the see of the new bishopric; [3] whether to write to William Poynter and to Joseph-Octave Plessis on the union of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick; [4] whether to assign any income to Alexander McDonell. Archival notes [with reference to Bulgaria, Serbia, Hungary, the United States]. The Sommario

The writer recalls the general congregation of 30 may 1825 [see *Cal. 1800-30* II 132], and [Pietro Caprano's] letters to Poynter [William Poynter](two letters dated 09 jul 1825 [see *Cal. 1800-30* V 200-201], one of which [*Cal. 1800-30* V 201] was meant to be shown to Henry Bathurst), to Ambroise Maréchal [see *Cal. 1800-30* V 197], and to Joseph-Octave Plessis [see *Cal. 1800-30* V 198]. Before answers to the said letters were received, other documents were acquired, showing that Joseph-Octave Plessis is not opposed to the erection of a bishopric in Upper Canada, but has doubts on the revenues of McDonell [Alexander McDonell] and fears the vacancy that would follow the latter's death; that William Poynter fears the dangers of episcopal vacancies, with particular regard to Bernard-Claude Panet and the Montréal disorders that followed Jean-Jacques Lartigue's appointment as vicar general, suffragan and auxiliary bishop [in the general congregation of 24 jan 1820; see *Cal. 1800-30* II 046], although he personally is in favour of a settlement; that Alexander McDonell asks that Thomas Weld be appointed his coadjutor. Reference is made to the following letters: William Poynter to Pietro Caprano, [London], 24 jun [24 jun 1825; in *Cal. 1800-30* III 297];

Furthermore, Henry Bathurst promised Alexander McDonell a pension and land. In his letter of 04 oct 1825 (Sommario, no. 7 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 303]), Joseph-Octave Plessis is in favour of Alexander McDonell's appointment, considering his person, his revenues, and the attitude of the British crown. He also favours Kingston as the see of the new bishopric, whereas York will be the see of the Anglican bishop. Although Bernard-Claude Panet was aware of Giacinto Sigismondo Gerdil's letter to Jean-François Hubert of 16 jan 1796 (the letter is missing, but see Giacinto Sigismondo Gerdil to Bartolomeo Pacca, 16 jan 1796, forwarded via Francis Morrogh in Lisbon [see *Cal. 1622-1799* V 427-428]), which made it clear that no coadjutor can be declared prior to the Holy See's approval, circumstances made

it necessary to obtain the approval of Lord Dalhousie, governor of the province [George Ramsay Dalhousie, governor of Lower Canada], and to publish it in Bernard-Claude Panet's first *mandement* [of 15 dec 1825; see *Cal. 1800-30* VI 159]. As explained in his letter of 12 dec 1825 to his procurator, Robert Gradwell [see *Cal. 1800-30* III 428], who was asked to inform Petro Caprano, his age (73), the necessity to stop possible troubles, and the fact that in the past the bishops of Québec always managed to have their candidate approved, made Bernard-Claude Panet's move necessary. In his two letters of 20 jan 1826 and 24 jan 1826 [see *Cal. 1800-30* III 429], William Poynter, vicar apostolic in the London district, justifies Bernard-Claude Panet's decision with the necessity to counter the enemies of Jean-Jacques Lartigue's appointment and with the fact that he could not suggest a slate of three candidates, owing to the [British] crown's thoroughness in knowing "all that is done there [in British North America]." As for precedents, reference is made to Pierre Denaut's death on 17 jan 1806, Joseph-Octave Plessis's letter to Pius VII of 12 feb 1806 [see *Cal. 1800-30* II 005], the general congregation of 21 jul 1806 [see *Cal. 1800-30* II 004], Domenico Coppola's audience with Pius VII of 24 jul 1806 [*recte* 20 jul 1806 or 27 jul 1806; see *Cal. 1800-30* II 005, IV 275], and the briefs sent to Bernard-Claude Panet [on 12 aug 1806; see *Cal. 1800-30* IV 008-009]. It is remarked that, in the case of Jean-Olivier Briand, the principle of election was excluded (see Giuseppe Maria Castelli to the nuncio [Pietro Pamphili Colonna, nuncio in France, of 22 jan 1786; see Cal. 1622-1799 V 183]), that Jean-Olivier Briand was not meant to select only one candidate, that Jean-François Hubert's appointment was not accepted by Leonardo Antonelli until Étienne Montgolfier's renunciation was received by Lord Sydney [Thomas Townshend, Baron Sydney; see Cal. 1622-1799 V 318]; that Giacinto Sigismondo Gerdil's important letter to Jean-François Hubert of 16 jan 1796 (missing [but see Cal. 1622-1799 V 427-428]) stated that no coadjutor should be appointed before the Holy See's approval was received; that Giacinto Sigismondo Gerdil's letter was disregarded by Jean-François Hubert and by Joseph-Octave Plessis (see Joseph-Octave Plessis to Michele Di Pietro, 17 feb 1806; see Cal. 1800-30 VI 023]. Other persons mentioned in the report are Clement XIII, Joseph-Marie La Corne de Chaptes, the nuncio [Giuseppe Maria Doria Pamphili, nuncio in France], the abbé de L'Isle-Dieu [Pierre de La Rue, abbé de L'Isle-Dieu], Clement XIV, Pius VI, Thomas Hussey, Stefano Borgia. The ponenza summarizes the general congregation of 06 mar 1826, the audience granted by the pope [Leo XII] on 19 mar [19 mar 1826], the letters of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" [i.e., Giulio Maria Della Somaglia] to Bernard-Claude Panet of 08 apr 1826 [see Cal. 1800-30 V 230] and to the vicars general [Alexander McDonell, Angus Bernard MacEachern, Jean-Jacques Lartigue, Joseph-Norbert Provencher] of 14 apr 1826 (Sommario, nos. 1-2 [see Cal. 1800-30 V 231-233, but the letter to Alexander McDonell is missing]). In his letter [to the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide"] of 23 feb [23 feb 1826; see Cal. 1800-30 III 470], William Poynter suggested Joseph Demers and Pierre-Flavien Turgeon as completing the slate for Bernard-Claude Panet's coadjutorship (but they have both refused), then he urged Robert Gradwell that the matter be completed and feared Henry Bathurst's departure from office (as reported [by Robert Gradwell to Giulio Maria Della Somaglia on 22 aug 1826; see Cal. 1800-30 III 467] in Sommario, no. 3). In his letter [to Giulio Maria Della Somaglia] of 17 jul 1826, Bernard-Claude Panet is startled at the delay of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" in appointing Joseph Signay, maintains that the procedure outlined in Giuseppe Maria Castelli's letter to Jean-Olivier Briand of 1770 [14 mar 1770; see Cal. 1622-1799 V 209] has never been enforced, makes reference to the "dark ages of the Republic [Roman Republic]," believes it impossible to withdraw the candidate (Joseph Signay) already approved by the British crown, announces that he has appointed Joseph Signay administrator of the diocese in case of his own death, and suggests that a general deal concerning the appointment of coadjutors be negotiated between the British court and Rome (Sommario, no. 4 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 471]). In his letter [of 04 aug 1826], Jean-Jacques Lartigue maintains that both Joseph Demers and Pierre-Flavien Turgeon are worthier candidates than Joseph Signay (and they might be forced to accept the coadjutorship), that a decision must be made whether the choice of the coadjutor is the privilege of the archbishop or of the British crown (since the latter replaced the French crown), and mentions Augustin Chaboillez (Sommario, no. 5 [see Cal. 1800-30 VI 146]). William Poynter's

letter [to Robert Gradwell, of 15 aug 1826] emphasizes the urgency of the matter (*Sommario*, no. 6 [see *Cal. 1800-30* III 468]). The writer [Bartolomeo Alberto Cappellari] points out that Bernard-Claude Panet's faculties do not include the appointment of an administrator, which in case of his death would be Jean-Jacques Lartigue [see *Cal. 1800-30* II 143-144], and that the answers of Angus Bernard MacEachern, Joseph-Norbert Provencher [and Alexander McDonell] were not yet received. The two queries are, [1] whether to ask the pope [Pius VII] to appoint Joseph Signay bishop *in partibus* and coadjutor of Bernard-Claude Panet, [2] how to deal with future appointments of coadjutors. The *Sommario* contains the above-mentioned documents.

The current situation is as follows: [1] Thomas Scallan is vicar apostolic in Newfoundland, Michael Anthony Fleming was appointed his coadjutor in the congregation of 1 jun [general congregation of 01 jun 1829; see Cal. 1800-30 II 182]; [2] William Fraser is vicar apostolic in Nova Scotia; [3] Bernard-Claude Panet replaced Joseph-Octave Plessis in 1826 [recte on 04 dec 1825] as archbishop of Québec, Joseph Signay is his coadjutor; his vicars general are Angus Bernard MacEachern (New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Cape Breton Island), Jean-Jacques Lartigue (Montréal),

Joseph-Norbert Provencher (Hudson Bay, James Bay); [4] Alexander McDonell is bishop of Upper Canada [bishop of Kingston, in Upper Canada], his coadjutor is Thomas Weld. A discussion of items 1-8 of the Sommario follows, in which William Poynter's opinion is considered in favour of Angus Bernard MacEachern (Sommario, no. 2), Bernard-Claude Panet's consent leaves room for doubtful interpretations (Sommario, nos. 6, 8), and Angus Bernard MacEachern's seems to doubt Bernard-Claude Panet's consent (Sommario, no. 7). The queries are, [1] Whether to ask the pope [Pius VIII] to erect the new bishopric of New Brunswick, Îles-de-la-Madeleine, and Prince Edward [Prince Edward Island], [2] Whether to attach Cape Breton [Cape Breton Island] to the vicariate apostolic of Nova Scotia, [3] Whether to appoint Angus Bernard MacEachern bishop of the new bishopric, were this to be erected. DESCRIPTION: J. Delaunay, who took to Rome some Osages, asked for financial assistance in order to pay their debts (that covered their living expenses) and to enable them to return to America [United States]. The case of *abbé* Fauvel

[Jean-Baptiste-François Fauvel], a cleric in minor orders, is recalled. In 1826 the latter took to Rome the Iroquois chief Tajorakaron [Teoragaron Ano8ara] (who was bestowed honours and circumstances), and asked to be appointed priest ad titulum missionis. Suspecting an oax, Pietro Caprano received permission from Leo XII to gather information on both Fauvel [Jean-Baptiste-François Fauvel] and Tajorakaron [Teoragaron Ano8ara], who then suddendly disappeared from the city and returned to America [i.e., Upper Canada and the United States Northwest Territory]. In his letter of 08 apr 1829 [see Cal. 1800-30 VI 340], Fenwick [Edward Dominick Fenwick], bishop of Cincinnati, reported that Tajorakaron [Teoragaron Ano8ara] was a drunkard and Fauvel [Jean-Baptiste-François Fauvel] a simoniac and one who showed a lascivious attitude towards young people; furthermore, that Fauvel [Jean-Baptiste-François Fauvel] was only allowed to operate a school at Green Bay in the Northwest for 14 months but was never ordained. Furthermore, Fauvel [Jean-Baptiste-François Fauvel], claiming direct dependence from Rome, started to act as a full priest and was threatened with excommunication. J. Delaunay's case might be similar to Fauvel [Jean-Baptiste-François Fauvel]'s, as neither Giuseppe Rosati, bishop of St. Louis (where the Osages live), nor other United States bishops or missionaries ever mentioned this matter. The writer points out how dangerous it is to trust these kind of travellers. [In Castruccio Castracane degli Antelminelli's handwriting] A report to the [new] pope [Pius VIII] is to be prepared, J. Delaunay is to be arrested, and the Indians are to be freed from being exploited.

The party, which also consists of a chief, his wife (currenly ill) and "un Guerrier" (others were left in Paris), received honours, financial assistance, medals and recognition by kings and princes. As for many years the Osage tribe wanted to "se civiliser" and to embrace the Faith, they decided to visit Europe "ainsi d'y acquerir des Connaissances et des moyens pour atteindre ce but" and to plead for missionary help. At home, Louis-Guillaume-Valentin Dubourg, bishop of Louisiana [recte bishop of New Orleans], promised help, and van Piterbourg [Charles Vanquikenborn], superior of the Jesuit convent in Missouri, visited their villages and lately sent a young missionary, whereas Protestant sects made little inroads among them. However, the delay in answering their petitions caused the party to live in poverty and in debt, and the recent permission to "Exiber les Sauvages" helped but little. They need financial assistance in order to reach Genoa or Marseilles.

Paragraph 59 contains three queries to be answered by the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide." They are followed by a Sommario. The writer makes reference to the general congregation of 19 feb 1827 [see Cal. 1800-30 II 168], to [Bartolomeo Alberto Cappellari's] letter to the nuncio in Paris [Emanuele Nicolò Lambruschini, of 14 apr 1827; see Cal. 1800-30 V 280], to the letters of the nuncio [Emanuele Nicolò Lambruschini, to Bartolomeo Alberto Cappellari and the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide"] of 04 jun 1827, [18 jun 1827], 28 nov 1827, and 12 oct 1827 [recte 12 dec 1827; see Cal. 1800-30 III 537 539-540 542], to the letter of the nuncio [Emanuele Nicolò Lambruschini, of 04 jun 1827] to the minister, Baron de Damas [Ange-Hyacinthe Maxence, Baron Damas, minister of Foreign Affairs; see Cal. 1800-30 III 538]. Although the nuncio [Emanuele Nicolò Lambruschini] (who had secret instructions to see that the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal receive adequate compensation in the case of a negative outcome) was confident that Lord Bathurst [Henry Bathurst] would soon be transferred to another department, the British crown maintains that the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal belongs to the crown and that the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal has no legal existence. The letter written by the Earl of Dudley [John William Ward], secretary of state for External Affairs, to the French chargé d'affaires in London [Charles-Joseph Roth, recte first secretary, of 21 sep 1827; see Cal. 1800-30 III 541] reveals that London believes that the end of seigneurial rights is necessary better to exploit the land, but that a compromise is sought with large compensation given to the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal (see Sommario, nos. 1-5). The four articles discussed between Jean-Henri-Auguste Roux and the British crown, on the matter of the cession of all seigneurial rights on the parts of the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal, are listed. They had been communicated by the French Ambassador, the Duc de Montmorency-Laval [Anne-Adrien-Pierre de Montmorency], to the secretary of state [Giulio Maria Della Somaglia, on 04 jan 1825; see Cal. 1800-30 III 545], by the latter to the prefect of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" [Bartolomeo Alberto Cappellari] on 09 jan 1828 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 544], and by Jean-Henri-Auguste Roux to the prefect of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" [Bartolomeo Alberto Cappellari] in his letter of 20 jan [20 jan 1828; see Cal. 1800-30 III 546]. Also mentioned are a letter that secretary of state Huskisson [William Huskisson, secretary of state for War and the Colonies], wrote to lieutenant general Lord Dalhousie [George Ramsay Dalhousie, lieutanent-governor of Lower Canada, of 08 dec 1827; see Cal. 1800-30 III 546], and the letter [of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide"] to Jean-Henri-Auguste Roux (Sommario, nos. 6-8). The matter seemed to be resolved to everybody's satisfaction, when the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" was informed of the opposition to the deal of the bishop of Telmissus (Jean-Jacques Lartigue), the archbishop of Québec [Bernard-Claude Panet], and the bishop of Fussala [Joseph Signay], who maintained that the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal, being only the administrator of its goods, could not give them away without the consent of the archbishop of Québec [Bernard-Claude Panet], that the pecuniary compensation they would receive would make them heavily dependent on and therefore loyal to British crown's subsidies, and that at any rate in future their pensions could be stopped by a less friendly crown that could decide to pursue the same policy with other Montréal establishments. Reference is made to the sending of Jean-Henri-Auguste Roux's articles to the archbishop [Bernard-Claude Panet] on 08 aug 1828, to Jean-Jacques Lartigue's letter of 15 aug 1828 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 547], to the letter of the archbishop of Québec [Bernard-Claude Panet] of 31 jan 1829 [see Cal. 1800-30 III 548], and to the letter of the Sacred

Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" [i.e., Castruccio Castracane degli Antelminelli] to Jean-Jacques Lartigue [of 14 feb 1829; see Cal. 1800-30 V 306] (see Sommario, nos. 9-12). The viewpoint of those opposing the deal has been fully explained by Pierre-Antoine Tabeau and Thomas Maguire, who in dec [recte on 25 nov 1829] arrived in Rome and met with the prefect of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" [Bartolomeo Alberto Cappellari]. Reference is made to the 1641 donation of the island of Montréal, to the 1763 Capitulation [Treaty of Paris, 10 feb 1763], to the abdication of the Paris Séminaire de Saint-Sulpice to its Canadian rights of 29 apr 1764 (act signed by Jean Cousturier, Yrieix de Beaupoil, Claude Bourachot, Louis Legrand, Jean-Joseph Moiroud, Étienne Montgolfier), to Joseph-Octave Plessis's letter to the colonial minister [secretary of state for War and the Colonies, Henry Bathurst, of 20 aug 1819; see Cal. 1800-30 III 551], to the letter of the archbishop of Québec [Bernard-Claude Panet] to the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal [i.e., Candide-Michel Le Saulnier, of 28 jan 1828; see Cal. 1800-30 III 554]. Pierre-Antoine Tabeau and Thomas Maguire also pointed out that in the likely occurrence of Lower Canada becoming part of the United States, the new government would not recognize former titles and rights. Furthermore, according to Pierre-Antoine Tabeau and Thomas Maguire, the law makes it impossible for the British crown simply to take possession of the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal without any compensation at all, on account of [almost] 70 years (from 1763 onwards) without change in its relationship with the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal. Moreover, as shown by George Ramsay Dalhousie's letters to Joseph Comte of 30 jan 1827 [and 08 feb 1827; see Cal. 1800-30 III 555 559], the British crown knows all too well how much the clergy's influence over the people is necessary to keep Lower Canada, in the event of a likely new war with the United States (see Sommario, nos. 13-19). The writer recalls how co-operation has not prevented the British crown from trying to impose Protestantism upon its Catholic subjects, especially in recent years, mentions the difficulties encountered in the sub-division of the immense diocese of Québec, and the fact that the Protestant bishop [Charles James Stewart, Church of England bishop of Québec] still prevents the bishop of Québec [Bernard-Claude Panet, archbishop of Québec] from using his full title, and fears that the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal be made into a Protestant school. The queries are, [1] whether to consider the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal a simple administrator and to oppose Jean-Henri-Auguste Roux's deal; [2] what would be the consequences of the said deal; [3] whether to order the Sulpician Seminary of Montréal to drop their deal.
