

## New Partnership Brings Together a Collection of Books from University of Ottawa Press and Saint Paul University

**Ottawa, June 3, 2025** – The University of Ottawa Press (PUO-UOP) and Saint Paul University (SPU) are delighted to announce a new partnership that will lead to the publication of four French-language essays based on the podcast series *L'USP en conversation*, presented in collaboration with *Le Droit*.

Scheduled for release in 2026 as part of the <u>101 Collection</u>, these four books, written in an engaging style by subject-matter experts, will offer insightful reflections on a range of timely topics.

Each of the four Saint Paul University faculty members participating in the project will present their manuscripts in French, within their respective areas of expertise.

**Jonathan Durand Folco** reflects on the impact of artificial intelligence on our future, examining its ethical and social implications.

"L'intelligence artificielle : au service de qui et de quoi ?"

**Bianca Briciu** explores the concept of transformative leadership and its role in creating positive change across sectors and communities.

"Qu'est-ce que le leadership transformatif?"

**Buuma Maisha** addresses sexual violence in conflict zones and its long-term effects on affected communities.

"Pourquoi fait-on tant de tort à l'autre?"

Finally, Saint Paul University rector **Louis Patrick Leroux** reflects on the future of universities and the vital role they will play in tomorrow's society.

"L'Université de demain : quel rôle à venir ?"
